

Quick Facts: 2024 JCF Scholarship Awards

Each spring, the Jewish Community Foundation, Inc. provides financial awards to students from South Jersey pursuing post-high school education. The following is an overview of the process:

- Awards are available predominantly, though not exclusively, for individuals of Jewish faith.
- **Apply online--** Get started at: www.jcfsnj.org/scholarships
- The application portal opens on or about December 15. The deadline to apply is **Friday, March 8, 2024 at 4:00 PM**. Award results will be announced in May 2024.
- All applicants must reside in either Burlington, Camden, or Gloucester county (exception: JWV Post 126 Award).
- The JCF offers a variety of separate scholarship awards, each one with its own criteria. Applicants should review the criteria for each award and then apply for any awards for which they feel qualified. Applicants must submit all necessary documents (i.e. essays, transcripts, etc.) as required by each award's guidelines.
- Approximately \$35,000 in awards in total are available each year. Award amounts vary, generally ranging from \$500 and up. Applicants may receive multiple awards.
- Awards are primarily paid directly to the institution where students owe tuition. (Note: we encourage awardees to contact their bursar's office to ensure that their award does not get displaced.)
- Each award is provided to a recipient once, for students planning to use the award in the upcoming school year. Anybody may reapply in future years as well.
- A committee of JCF volunteers reviews and approves all awards. A reception will be held in June for awardees and their families to celebrate the occasion.

Leonard Jay Hirschfeld Memorial	Graduating high school students to purchase technology equipment or training
Freda & Sam Yacker Israel Experience	Jewish students 18-25 years old who will travel to Israel for post-secondary education
Benjamin Asbell Youth Upsilon Lambda Phi Fraternity	9th-12th graders active in Jewish community, for personal enrichment, including Israel travel
